

What type of research can I do?

Here are some examples of community cancer investigation questions you could explore after participating in ASCCN training modules:

Would restaurant or bar owners support a ban on smoking? Where do students have access to junk food or healthy food? Can the stories of cancer survivors motivate others to be screened? How can I map cancer in my family? What type of radio or TV cancer messages can have a positive impact? How do different generations in my church think about cancer? Does my physical environment contain cancer risk factors? How can I adapt a cancer brochure to fit the Samoan community? What can we learn from ex-smokers to help more people quit smoking? What obstacles do cancer patients face in maintaining their health?
